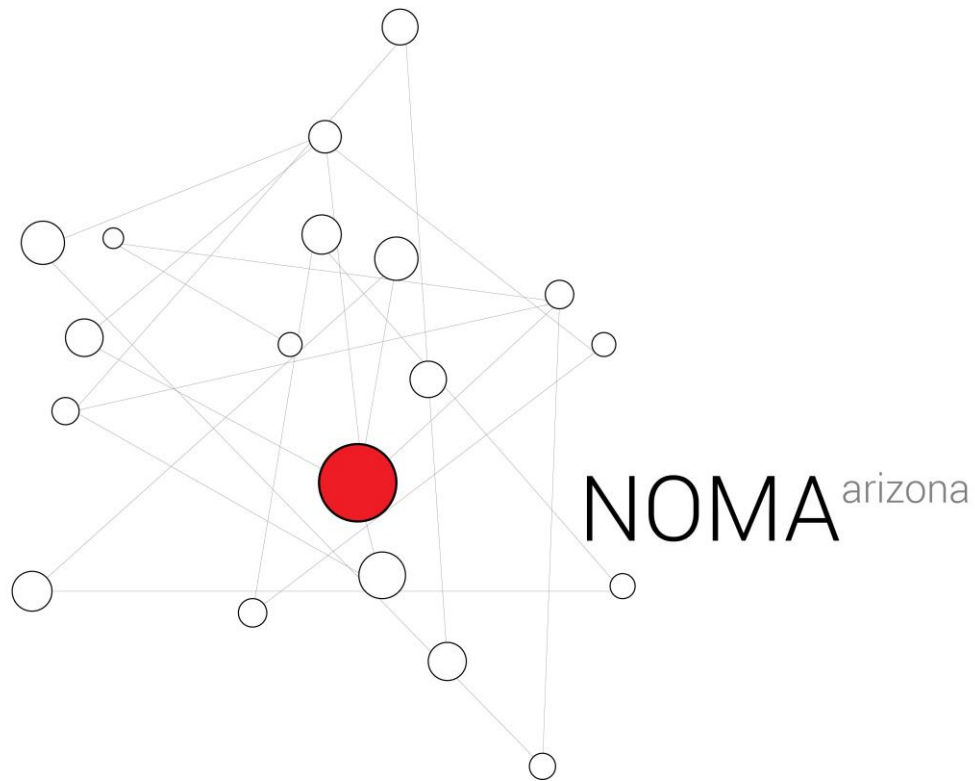

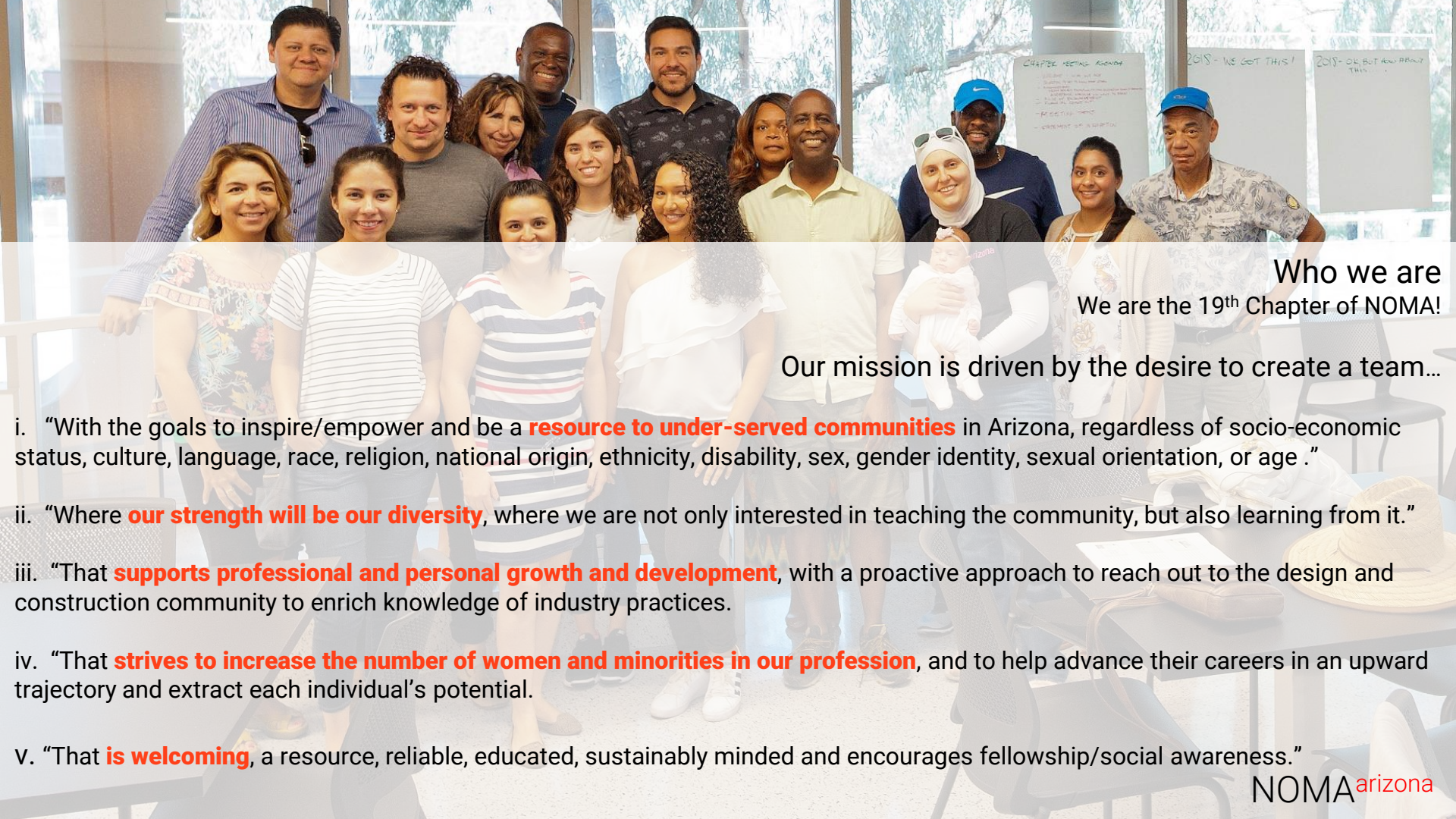
Who Are We?

In 1971, at the Detroit AIA Convention, 12 African American architects convened from all over the country and recognized a despairing absence of an alliance committed to the growth and development of minority architects. This meeting evolved creating the National Organization of Minority Architects (NOMA).

NOMA is now a nationally recognized professional organization created to *“champion diversity within the design professions by promoting the excellence, community engagement, and professional development of its members.”*

Required Documents (in 3 separate sections):

- (1) Completed NOMA Arizona Scholarship Application
- (2) Current Willard Transfer of GED Application
- (3) Student will send copy of one of following awards to NOMA and NOMA will forward award nomination
- (4) Yes (if) Nominal member letter from non-family member who can attest to the applicant's academic achievement, community service or career potential
