

In 1971, at the Detroit AIA Convention, 12 African American architects convened from all over the country and recognized a despairing absence of an alliance committed to the growth and development of minority architects. This meeting evolved creating the National Organization of Minority Architects (NOMA).

NOMA is now a nationally recognized professional organization created to "champion diversity within the design professions by promoting the excellence, community engagement, and professional development of its members."
